

**MINUTES OF THE
ANCHORAGE CITY COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING**

**Monday, November 08, 2021
6:00 p.m.**

Council members in attendance were Diane Cook, Matt Delehanty, Patrick McMahon, Bill Wetherton, and Hunter Wilson. Also, in attendance were Mayor Neil Ramsey, Assistant City Attorney Richard Edwards, City Administrator Reneé Major, Police Chief Dean Hayes, Deputy Treasurer Alison Melton, and Clerk/Receptionist Angie Chick. Council member Jason Walters did not attend.

Mayor Ramsey called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.

City Administrator Reneé Major introduced the new Deputy Treasurer, Alison Melton to City Council.

MINUTES

Wilson motioned to approve the October 11, 2021 regular meeting minutes. Delehanty seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT

There were no questions about the treasurer's report.

POLICE REPORT

Chief Hayes announced that he has re-hired Officer Cheri Bower and that the department is at full staff. An order has been placed for two new (2022) police vehicles. Chief Hayes also reported a missing person from the Bellewood Campus. Two juveniles escaped from the Bellewood Campus on October 23rd; one was returned, and Bellewood is going through procedures for the return of the other. A juvenile walked away on November 8th, was found, and returned the same day.

Cook asked if there had been any issues with large trucks on Glenbrook Road. Chief Hayes said it has occasionally been an issue, and only one time recently.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

There were no questions about the Historic Preservation Commission report.

FORESTRY BOARD REPORT

Chairperson Lucy Spickard was absent. Major stated the hazardous tree program is in progress. Public Works Director Gary Burkhead will validate whether trees on the list are in the City's rights-of-way or on private property. The Forestry Board will send hazardous tree notification letters to owners for trees located on private property.

Landscape architect Greg Bennett submitted a plan for the land across from the Anchorage Post Office. A meeting to review the plans will be held on November 11th.

NEW BUSINESS

Special Hours License – Ten20 Craft Brewery, 11505 Park Road

Jim McGuire, Dean Holland, and Chip Hamm presented the special hours alcoholic beverage license request for Ten20 Craft Brewery. The brewery will offer a tap room experience with beer, seltzers, and high-end food. Parking for their patrons was discussed. Chief Hayes requested a light be installed for the safety of pedestrians crossing the road behind the Post Office. Mayor said Sunday special hours licenses require City Council approval, and confirmed that approval is good for one year. Two other Anchorage businesses already have the same type of license. Wilson motioned to approve the Ten20 Craft Brewery special hours/Sunday license. Cook seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Entrance Gate and Fence Height Variance, Tim and Cece Hagan, 1908 Evergreen Road

Architect Dan Grimm presented the Hagan's plans to build new stone columns and a four-board fence in their front yard. The stone pillars will be approximately 5'10" high with lights atop that measure an additional two feet. The fence will be the typical 4' high fence and may vary an inch or two. Samples of similar pillars in Anchorage were presented along with written approvals from neighbors. Wilson motioned to approve the height variance request. Cook seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Upcoming holiday events were announced.

Other items of interest were mentioned by Mayor Ramsey: Anchorage residents in the Anchorage School District recently received Jefferson County tax bills which included a school add-on tax. Major is waiting on a reply from Jefferson County Sheriff's office as to how the correction and

possible refund will be handled. A ReachAlert and notice on the city's website will follow. Ramsey also noted the Fire and EMS tax increased 10.3%.

Wetherton said Anchorage Boy Scout James Kral is working with vendors to obtain the stone monuments to complete Eagle Scout Veterans Memorial project in front of City Hall.

Wilson motioned to adjourn the meeting. Wetherton seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:21 p.m.
