## ANCHORAGE BOOK CLUB HOSTS SPECIAL COMMUNITY YARD SALE TO HELP RAISE \$1 MILLION

In September 2012, Anchorage resident Reece King was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL) – blood cancer. Soon after his diagnosis, Make-A-Wish Foundation informed Reece that he qualified for a wish of his choice. He settled on a treehouse from Pete Nelson, the host of Treehouse Masters on Animal Planet. Reece learned that three other children had also wished for a treehouse. Knowing he “wanted” but didn’t “need” a treehouse, Reece opted to use his wish to help others instead, and with that, “Reese’s Wish to Raise \$1 Million” was born. Reece’s Wish will support upgrades to patient rooms and common areas at Kosair Children’s Hospital in Louisville and Kentucky Children’s Hospital in Lexington. It will help grant wishes to nearly 200 children in Kentucky on the Make-A-Wish Foundation waiting list, and it will support the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and its mission to find a cure for many types of cancer.

After months of intense chemotherapy, Reece, now 13, is in full remission and is doing well. Touched by his story, the ladies of an Anchorage book club

have decided to help make Reece’s Wish come true. On Saturday, August 22, the ladies will hold a benefit Community Yard Sale in the Fellowship Hall of Anchorage Presbyterian Church from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. If you would like to help, they are taking donated items on Wednesday, August 19, from 4 to 7 p.m., and Thursday, August 20, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the church. They are accepting the following items: children’s clothes (size 8 and under only), women’s accessories, toys, household items, tools, furniture, sports equipment, books, and DVDs. ## ONE LOT – ONE RESIDENCE

Most of Anchorage is zoned **residential single-family**, where only one residence is permitted per property. On occasion, residents contact City Hall about renting a carriage house, cottage, or garage apartment on their property, or they would like to have family members live in a separate residence or guest suite.

Renting a separate living space on residential single-family zoned property creates multi-residences on the single-family lot, and violates the County and Anchorage-adopted Zoning Code.

With the exception of *The Anchorage*, which secured a special-use permit as a bed and breakfast establishment from the City of Anchorage and the Louisville Metro Board of Zoning Adjustment, lodging and boarding houses, where rent is charged, are not permitted in Anchorage. Guest houses and guest quarters for temporary (non-paying) visitors are allowed as long as the dwelling does not have a full kitchen (range/oven) installed.

If a resident has a rented second residence on his/her property, he/she should kindly notify the tenants that they must find other lodging, and please refrain from renting the dwelling again. People seeking rental property should have no trouble finding suitable lodging in the many multi-family-zoned properties surrounding Anchorage.
