2017 FIRECRACKER RUN

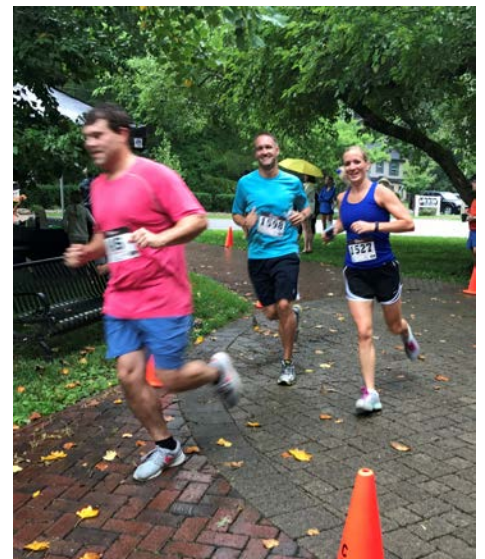

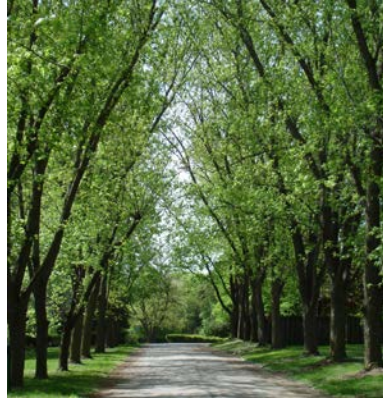

Trees Are Thirsty, Too!

Remember to make sure that your trees stay adequately watered through the hot summer months. Consistent hydration is especially necessary for newly planted trees. Donut-shaped, drip-watering bags may be purchased at City Hall for \$16 each (cash or check made payable to City of Anchorage).



2017 Fall Canopy Campaign

Order forms and information for the Fall Canopy Tree Campaign will be included in the September issue of *The Anchor Age*. The City pays for half the cost of the trees and professional planting, which will occur in November. Trees must be planted no nearer than 15 feet from the edge of the road to qualify for the reduced-price program. Now is a great time to evaluate your landscape and plan to ensure a continued shade canopy.

ARE YOU READY FOR THE SOLAR ECLIPSE?

A total solar eclipse will be visible in the United States on Monday, August 21st. The path of the full eclipse is approximately 70 miles wide. In Anchorage, a partial solar eclipse will be visible and it will start at 12:59 p.m. with maximum coverage of the sun occurring at 2:27 p.m., and it will end at 3:51 p.m. Now is a good time to order special glasses for viewing the eclipse or research methods for indirect viewing.

LABOR DAY TRASH PICK-UP DELAYED

Labor Day will be on Monday, September 4, 2017. Trash, recycling, and yard waste pick up will run on a one-day delay for the entire week.

Anchorage City Hall will be closed September 4th and will reopen at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 5th.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION ON OLD HENRY RD.

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) announced an improvement project for the I-265/Old Henry Road interchange. The project began at the end of June with a newly installed traffic light. The project also involves building additional turning lanes on the northbound and southbound exit ramps as well as improving turn lane capacities along Old Henry Road. Construction is scheduled for completion by October 2017.

EXPECT TRAVEL DELAY THE MORNING OF SEPTEMBER 9TH

Norton Healthcare's annual charity event, Bike to Beat Cancer, will be held on Saturday, September 9th. The bicyclists will come through Anchorage between 9:00 a.m. and 9:35 a.m. They will be biking from Frey's Hill Road along Evergreen Road to Osage Road, and exiting Anchorage using Lucas Lane.



JUNKED VEHICLE REMINDER

Please do not store junked vehicles in public view on any property located in Anchorage! City of Anchorage Ordinance §92.20 defines, in part, junked vehicles as any motor vehicle

(defined by KRS 186.010 (4) and (8)) which is inoperative (wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled, or discarded or remains inoperative for a continuous period of more than 120 days) and does not have an unexpired license plate. Junked vehicles are deemed a public nuisance, and they are an eyesore, invite vandalism, and often become an unwanted habitat for undesirable critters.
