This year's Canopy Campaign trees have been planted, and the program has concluded for the year. The Forestry Board thanks participating residents for their patience with the weather-related delays.

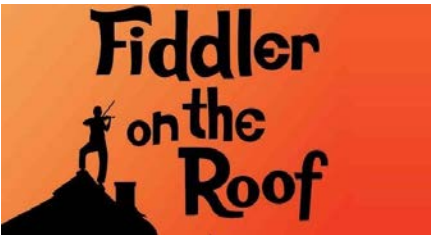
Tree Guards

Residents are strongly encouraged to use tree guards to protect young trees from deer and other wildlife. The guards are available at City Hall for \$4 each. The new guards are taller than those previously offered. They are approximately 4 feet high and can be customized or cut down in size.

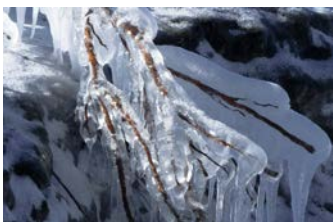
NEW ANCHORAGE CELLTOWER

Construction of the new cell tower next to Anchorage City Hall began December 1st, when a huge drilling rig arrived. Crews used a 94" bit to drill more than 30' through dirt and rock. On Monday, December 12th, the giant hole was filled with rebar and concrete, then topped with the tower's anchor plate. The monopole and a huge crane arrived on Friday, December 16th, and the crews began erecting the new tower. Once the tower was completed, the crane placed new cellphone antennas, which had been assembled on the ground, atop the tower.



RENTAL RULES

Properties that are zoned residential in the City of Anchorage are limited to one residence per property. Homeowners may not rent a second location on their property to a non-family member.



Trash receptacles left out after service can create a road hazard for drivers, especially at night. Empty trash cans can easily be blown into the roads by gusty winds. Please be sure to retrieve all street-side trash cans after they have been emptied.

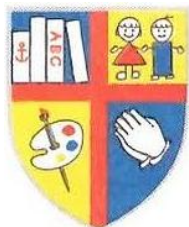
KEEP OUR STREETS TIDY AND SAFE

REPUBLIC SERVICES WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

Icy inclines and low hanging tree limbs and wires can prevent drivers from completing back door trash collections. The driver will not risk running off driveways and damaging lawns if drives are not plowed or adequately salted in bad weather conditions. The driver also cannot risk hitting tree limbs or pulling down wires when they're drooping due to heavy snow or ice build-up. Unrestrained dogs, and blocked carts and driveways can also prevent collection. Please remind snow plow personnel to keep the path to carts clear of piled snow.

PET REMINDER

Please remember when dogs are not on the premises of the owner, they must be restrained by a lead or leash. For the safety of your pet and everyone around, please keep pets on a leash. Pet owners should also regularly check electric collars and underground fences to make sure they are in proper working order.

HAZARDOUS TREE REMOVAL

Removal of hazardous trees along Anchorage roadsides will begin in early January. The Anchorage Forestry Board marked trees that will be removed with numbers in orange paint.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Any tree 6-foot tall or less can be handled by the Republic Services driver. Trees larger than 6-foot should be cut into 4-foot lengths and placed curbside. The bases of large trees are quite heavy; by cutting larger trees into 4-foot sections the tree can be safely handled by a single person.
