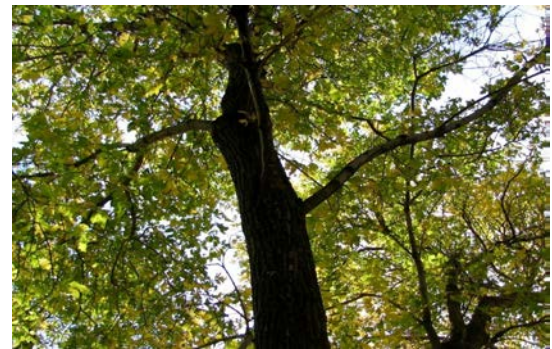

Yew Dell Botanical Gardens

– from humble beginnings to global impact

Wednesday, March 16th at 6:00 p.m.
Anchorage City Hall, 1306 Evergreen

Dr. Paul E. Cappiello, Executive Director of Yew Dell Botanical Gardens since 2002 and an adjunct associate professor with the Univ. of KY's Dept. of Horticulture, will be the featured speaker. Dr. Cappiello has served as the Horticulture Director at Bernheim Forest from 1997 to 2002 and was Associate Professor of Horticulture at the Univ. of Maine from 1987 to 1997. He is known nationally and internationally for his work on ornamental plants. He is the author of a highly regarded book on dogwoods and a weekly horticulture column for *The Courier-Journal*. He will speak about Yew Dell Botanical Gardens and will address questions about forestry and gardening topics.

Following the program, residents may take home, at no charge, up to 3 trees per household.
