## IT'S TIME TO VOTE!

On November 6, 2018, Anchorage residents have the opportunity to vote for the City Mayor, six City Council members, and four

Anchorage School Board members. All three precincts in Anchorage vote at Anchorage Presbyterian Church at 11403 Park Road. Visit the Jefferson County Election Center's website at <http://elections.jeffersoncountyclerk.org/> and click "Where Do I Vote" to find a sample ballot.

As the November election draws near, more and more election signs are going up around the City. Proudly post political signs in the proper place to avoid them being removed. Signs have a zero setback from the property line and can be no closer than ten feet from the curb and/or street edge. If a property line is more than ten feet from the street, signs shall be placed on the property line. Anchorage's sign ordinance allows political signs to be a maximum of six square feet.

Signs may be posted no more than 30 days prior to elections and shall be removed within five days of the election. Signs are prohibited from being attached to trees, fences, or utility poles and may not have balloons attached to them. Removed signs will be held next to the front door of the Anchorage Public Works building for several days and can be picked up at any time.



## ANCHORAGE CITY TAXES

As of November 1, delinquent taxes are subject to a 25% penalty and interest. Please remit your payment as soon as possible to avoid additional interest.

Payments may be dropped off at City Hall Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. or after hours at the Anchorage Police Department. Please contact Sara Ritchie at City Hall (502) 245-4654 with questions.

The Anchorage Historic Preservation Commission was established to oversee changes to properties within the Historic District. Properties owners benefit from the stabilization of neighborhoods and enhanced property values. Each property owner participates in maintaining those characteristics that make this town unique. Owners are reminded they must obtain a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) from the Anchorage Historic Preservation Commission before they build or demolish a structure, or undertake any exterior alterations. Homeowners who fail to obtain or abide by the terms and conditions of their COA are subject to fines.

**New Traffic Patterns on Highway 146 at Bellewood Road and at Glenbrook Road – thanks to the assistance from the Highway 146 Anchorage Resident Committee!**

The City of Anchorage wishes to acknowledge and thank the Anchorage Highway 146 Resident Committee for serving on this volunteer committee. The committee chaired by Mayor Hewitt and City Council member Cece Hagan included Anchorage residents: Laura Linkous, Kimberly Glass, Holly Swisher, Emilie Delehanty, Tamara Ecken, and Chris Boone. The goal of this appointed committee was to reduce and control increased east-west traffic through Anchorage on Kentucky State Highway 146 and promote road safety for all pedestrians and residents. The committee met several times earlier this year. Their efforts culminated with a meeting with the Kentucky Department of Transportation (DOT) District #5 to discuss strategies and options and review new traffic-calming patterns at three major Highway 146 intersections in Anchorage: Bellewood, Evergreen Road, and Glenbrook Road. Highway 146 is a state-controlled highway. In May, the committee made their suggestions and recommendations for two of the three intersections to Anchorage City Council who endorsed the proposed intersection patterns put forth by DOT District #5. Painting of the Bellewood and Glenbrook Road intersections was recently completed in mid-October.

Thank you for a job well-done! Please be sure to pay attention to the new traffic patterns at the Bellewood and Glenbrook intersections; stay within the painted lines, and be a good example for other drivers to follow the same.

The City is continuing the good efforts of the Highway 146 Resident Committee by consulting with an independent traffic engineer to further study Anchorage roads for the purpose of increasing traffic-calming measures on other residential streets and facilitating efficient vehicle traffic flow on Anchorage's other major roadways.
