YARD WASTE COLLECTIONS

Republic Services (R.S.) and the City remind residents that yard waste should be placed curbside no sooner than the evening before service and no later than 6:30 a.m. on Thursday mornings.



Each household is allowed a **weekly maximum** of:

- 16 paper bags not to exceed 50 pounds, **or**
- 5 R.S. containers, **or**
- 8 level trash cans no heavier than 30 pounds.

Make sure bags are of sufficient strength to contain without breakage.

Tree limbs and sticks must be cut and bundled in 3-foot lengths; limbs cannot be larger than 6-inches in diameter. The hauler will not pick up dirt, stumps, mulch, trees, fencing, construction materials, etc. in either the trash or yard waste.

Yard waste for the entire City is collected on Thursdays. The above limitations were established so that the large truck is able to service all households that day. Quantity overages, insufficiently bundled items, and non-collectable materials will be left at the curb.

Anchorpalooza Summer Concert

Approximately 25 women participated, and North won 21-16. Many people turned out to enjoy a beautiful day, food trucks, games, and live music. GOLF CART REGULATIONS

Golf carts are fun and easy ways to get around town, whether it's getting kids to and from school, going to a neighbor's house, or running errands. Anchorage, unlike surrounding cities, allows residents to use golf carts. However, a permit must be obtained and placed on a golf cart before it is driven on any public roadway of the City of Anchorage. Any person operating a golf cart must possess a valid operator's license and have it in his or her possession. Proof of insurance must be kept inside the golf cart at all times. Golf carts may operate only on roads with a posted speed limit of 35 mph or less, and only during the time after official sunrise and before official sunset. Please visit the City of Anchorage website or stop by City Hall for instructions on how to obtain a golf cart permit and a full list of regulations.

STREET TREE CANOPY CAMPAIGN

The 2017 Street Canopy Tree Campaign is off and running. Residents who have placed orders will be notified about program status updates via email. Flags to mark tree locations will be delivered to residents in October. Weather permitting, the trees will be planted before Thanksgiving.

TREE GUARDS

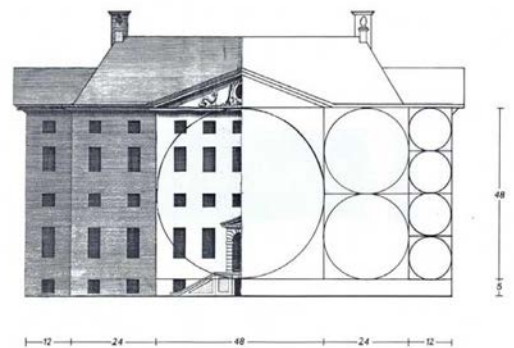

HARVEST FESTIVAL AT USPIRITUS

Forestry Board members will present a fun activity for children on Sunday, October 15th, at the Harvest for Hope Fall Festival on the Bellewood campus of Uspiritus. The festival is free and open to the community.

PILLARS OF PRESERVATION

When evaluating plans for new construction in the Historic District, the Anchorage Historic Preservation Commission ensures the structures will maintain the character of Anchorage. The Commission looks at criteria including design, scale, proportions, materials, and other factors. Scale is explained by renowned Architect, Steven Holl, in his essay on proportion, scale and perception: "One of the intuitive powers of humans is the perception of subtle mathematical proportions in the physical world. Just as we can tune musical instruments with a minuteness of proportional adjustment to produce harmonies, so we have an analogous ability to appreciate visual and spatial proportional relations. In music, as in architecture and any of the visual arts, these sensibilities must be cultivated." It is the goal of the Anchorage Historic Preservation Commission to preserve and cultivate a built environment that reflects these sensibilities.



Understanding Zoning Regulations

All construction in the City of Anchorage must meet zoning regulations in order to receive a building permit. These regulations include setbacks, floor area ratio and impervious surface maximums. Floor area ratio limits are set according to how a property is zoned, and range from 10% to 16% maximum coverage of the lot. Floor area ratio limits have remained the same for approximately 30 years, at which time the ratios were lowered. No variances are allowed to floor area ratios. Impervious surface for all properties is limited to 20% coverage of a property without a variance. For more information on zoning regulations, please call or stop by Anchorage City Hall.
