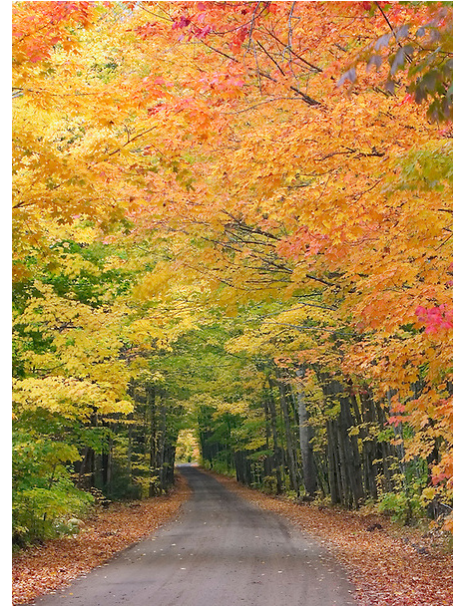


## ANCHORAGE FORESTRY BOARD FALL CANOPY CAMPAIGN

Enclosed in this issue is an order form for the 2016 Canopy Tree Campaign. These trees are to be planted in the 15 to 20-foot roadway easement area to create a street canopy. The prices listed for the canopy trees represent half the cost of each tree plus half the total cost of planting. The City of Anchorage pays the other half of the cost. Please read the form carefully and sign the agreement. **Orders are due by September 15<sup>th</sup>.** Because quantities of some trees may be limited, orders will be filled in the order of receipt. Please check specific characteristics of the trees you wish to order (height, spread, growth rate, etc.). Multiple online resources are available, and a reference copy of Michael Dirr's Manual of Woody Landscape Plants is offered at City Hall for your research.

### SPECIAL OFFER

This year, the Forestry Board is providing a special offer of 'Cherokee Princess' dogwoods. Since these dogwood trees are not included in the street canopy program, the City cannot share their cost. Instead, the trees are offered to you at full wholesale price, which includes planting by the City's contractor anywhere in your FRONT yard, but please *not* in the 20-foot right-of-way. (Note: This dogwood variety requires partial shade.) The Forestry Board will follow the same procedures for marking and planting these trees that is outlined in the Canopy Tree Campaign Agreement.



## Cavallo Restaurant

A new restaurant is planned for downtown Anchorage at the intersection of Evergreen Road and Station Road. A date to break ground on the 4,686 square foot building has not been finalized. The restaurant is expected to open sometime next year. It will be valet parking only and will feature a 1,142 square foot patio.

## THANK YOU

The City of Anchorage would like to thank the residents along Evergreen Road that granted easements on their property for the walking path. The City appreciates your patience for the long delays caused by the inclement weather. The City has two more walking path projects underway: Bellewood Road from the Anchorage School to North Arbor Drive and Osage Road East from Evergreen Road to Stone Gate Road. A new Wagner Park connector from Hazelwood Road to the Osage Road Entrance of Wagner Park is also planned. Stay tuned to Reach Alert for traffic delays and construction notices.

### SELF-DEFENSE CLASS

The Anchorage Police Department conducted its first self-defense and awareness class on Saturday, August 6, 2016 at the Anchorage Public School gymnasium. Approximately twenty people of all ages participated.

This was a hands-on class with demonstrations and practical exercises involving techniques used to defend against a physical attack. The police also shared information on situational awareness. The Anchorage Police Department will hold additional self-defense classes later in the year.

### Gov. Lawrence Wetherby Memorial Project in Middletown

Gov. Lawrence Wetherby is a native son of Middletown – and the only governor born and raised in Jefferson County to graduate from Anchorage High School. A Hall of Fame athlete at U of L, he practiced law here until he became lieutenant governor. He served as governor from 1950 to 1955 and is being honored with a life-size bronze statue in Middletown.

Wetherby is credited with moving our state forward in the areas of education, roads and tourism, conservation and state parks, mental health, juvenile courts, and more.

The Campaign Committee has been fundraising locally and is down to the last \$19,000 they need to raise for casting the statue and constructing the memorial. Would you like to help? Construction of the memorial is underway in Wetherby Park at Middletown City Hall, and the statue is to be unveiled in October.



### MSD Project Nears Early Completion of Construction Phase

The end is in sight for the Anchor Estates Pump Station Removal Project. The last pump station, which is on Pine Way, is scheduled for removal by mid-August. When the construction phase is complete, the land will be graded. Seeding will take place in September for optimal growth results.

This Louisville MSD project includes the construction of 10,000 feet of gravity interceptor sewer and the removal of three pumping stations: Anchor Estates #1 and #2, and Bellewood. The elimination of these small pump stations will prevent sewer overflows at the sites and provide protection to local ponds and Owl Creek.

The Kentucky Office of Highway Safety presented Anchorage Police Officer Greg Raque with the 2016 Occupant Protection Award for his performance in enforcing Kentucky's seat belt laws. Congratulations!
